Did You Know? Rodomontade (which can also be spelled "rhodomontade") originated in Italian poetry. Rodomonte was a fierce and boastful king in Orlando Innamorato, Count Matteo M. Boiardo's late 15th century epic, and later in the sequel Orlando Furioso, written by poet Lodovico

Ariosto in 1516. In the late 16th century, English speakers began to use "rodomont" as a noun meaning "braggart."
